Resident & Family Support

The JPS Family Medicine Residency Program is designed to test your limits, but that doesn't mean you have to go at it alone. We aim to foster physician well-being in a supportive educational environment while focusing on the promotion of well-being and improvement of resiliency factors related to meaning in daily work as a physician.

Well-Being Goals

1. Foster psychological/emotional safety, compassion, and empathy among all residents, fellows, faculty, and staff
2. Support residents' and fellows' physical, emotional, psychological, spiritual, financial, and intellectual health
3. Provide education on well-being
4. Destigmatize, raise awareness, and establish a process for mental health complaints
5. Promote use of confidential support resources at or outside of JPS Health Network

Family Medicine Curriculum

JPS residents may select either three or four years of residency training. As part of the ACGME AIRE Program (Advancing Innovation in Residency Education) residents may complete four years of training in select areas of emphasis such as obstetrics, sports medicine, geriatrics, hospital medicine, rural medicine, or additional procedural experiences. The resident's area of emphasis is additional training on top of a strong generalist foundation.

Areas of Interest

Behavioral Medicine

All JPS Family Medicine residents receive training in behavioral medicine aimed at producing well-rounded, do-it-all family doctors. Interns spend time with behavioral medicine faculty in a variety of contexts including behavioral medicine/health psychology clinic, street medicine outreach, and psychosocial specialty clinics (oncology). Curriculum also includes cases and workshops focused on psychiatric diagnosis/management, communication skills, and health and behavior change as well as inpatient medical consult and liaison psychiatry experiences. In addition, there are opportunities for advanced training in both a behavioral medicine certificate (elective options in behavioral medicine, psychiatry, and addiction), and a four year behavioral medicine track (elective options, opportunities to have your own CBT training and caseload). Additionally, residents who choose the four year track option have the opportunity to earn a masters degree in counseling with a focus on family therapy.

Trauma and Emergency Medicine

JPS is Tarrant County's Level I Trauma Center and has more than 125,000 emergency department visits per year. At JPS, you'll be exposed to countless pathologies and treat many diseases in their most advanced stages. Residents are front-line providers in advanced resuscitation, trauma management, and acute care. There are countless opportunities for procedural training, and residents are fully integrated into the multidisciplinary team. Opportunities are available for residents to complete an Advanced Acute Care track with additional experiences in Emergency/Critical Care and procedures.



Underserved Populations

JPS Health Network is located in the inner city of the Fort Worth-Dallas Metroplex and is the only health network in Tarrant County dedicated to caring for medically vulnerable populations. From day one, you will be an integral part of our team's efforts to care for those who need us most.



Adult Medicine and Critical Care

Many residents consider adult medicine and critical care to be some of the best experiences. Our residents obtain the confidence to diagnose and care for a diverse population with a variety of diseases rarely seen outside a public hospital. Residents also care for continuity patients alongside family medicine faculty on inpatient teams.

Lifestyle Medicine

JPS Family Medicine residents have the option to participate in a 24-month Lifestyle Medicine track, certified by the American College of Lifestyle Medicine (ACLM). Lifestyle factors are being increasingly recognized for their central role in the prevention and management of chronic disease. Accordingly, the next generation of primary care physicians can benefit from having advanced training in this growing sub-discipline. Upon completion of this track, residents will be eligible to sit for the ACLM board certification exam in Lifestyle Medicine.

Pediatrics & Adolescents

Over the years, pediatrics has become one of the strengths of our program. Our residents do rotations at both Children's Health Dallas and Cook Children's in Fort Worth – two of the top pediatric hospitals in the world. The inpatient and emergency medicine rotations are some of the most popular resident experiences.

Rural Medicine

With so many people relying on them for medical care, rural physicians have to be ready for anything. At JPS, our rural medicine training program is nationally recognized as one of the best in the country. You'll learn to handle internal medicine, ICU, emergency medicine, procedures, orthopedics, and obstetrics with complete confidence. Plus, residents routinely rotate through several small Texas communities with JPS alumni. It's this kind of real-world experience that sets JPS apart.

Global Medicine

Practicing medicine on a global scale comes with its own unique set of challenges and opportunities. On any given day, you might find yourself treating people with cerebral malaria, eclampsia, severe malnutrition, or a venomous snake bite.

That's why the training you receive at JPS is designed to help you be ready for anything. Residents considering a global medicine career have the opportunity to treat refugees from around the world in our International Health Clinic, be part of the Acclaim Street Medicine team, and provide care for people living with HIV. We offer global health didactics twice a month and rotations in a dozen locations in Latin America, sub-Saharan Africa, and Asia. Many of our residents who are preparing for overseas service opt to stay on for a fourth year of advanced training in surgical obstetrics or general surgery.

Sports Medicine

At JPS, we introduce all our family medicine residents to sports medicine because we know this type of treatment is useful far beyond the playing field. Sports medicine training gives our residents the opportunity to examine, diagnose, and treat common musculoskeletal pathology under more extreme conditions than you would generally find in a primary care facility.



Residents receive comprehensive, hands-on training for the examination and treatment of athletes at a variety of facilities and attend lectures by sports medicine physicians. JPS Sports Medicine Physicians are the official team doctors for Texas Christian University, and they work with a variety of athletic programs and organizations in the Fort Worth area.

Obstetrics

One of the hallmarks of the JPS Family Medicine Residency Program is maternity care. Operative obstetrics is emphasized in the Maternal Child Health Area of Emphasis (MCH AOE). Since its inception over fifteen years ago, graduates have each performed over 150 Cesarean sections during their MCH rotations. Operative obstetrics is emphasized in the third and fourth year maternal-child, rural, and international medicine areas of emphasis. MCH residents also complete a formal obstetric, procedural, and ultrasound curriculum.

The pediatric hospitalist inpatient experience provides unique one-on-one care for a variety of general pediatric conditions. They will experience high-volume nursery care, neonatal resuscitation, and pediatric outpatient care. Residents care for the 4,000 babies born at JPS each year through experiences in our nursery, NICU, and outpatient clinics after discharge.



Geriatric, Hospice and Palliative Medicine

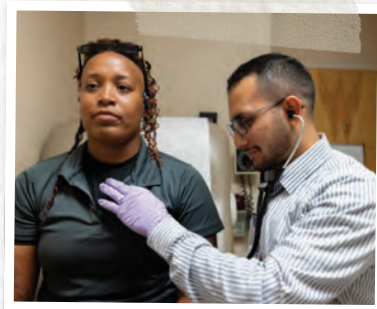
Each resident receives longitudinal experience in providing comprehensive care for the older adult and complex patient that emphasizes interdisciplinary collaboration in diverse clinical settings. Residents can choose to participate in a Hospice and Palliative Medicine rotation that prepares them to provide the holistic, multidisciplinary care that patients need and expect. JPS offers one-year fellowships in Sports Medicine, Geriatric Medicine and Hospice and Palliative Medicine.

**As an ACGME AIRE participant, we are partnering with each of our three fellowships to integrate Sports, Geriatric, or Hospice and Palliative Medicine training over four years, providing flexibility in training and preparing residents to be Board eligible for both Family Medicine and the fellowship CAQ.

Community Medicine

This track is designed to be a three- or four-year program where residents will gain knowledge and competency in the principles of community and public health and will have the opportunity to obtain a degree or certificate in a chosen area of their choosing: Public Health, Lifestyle Medicine, Obesity Medicine, or HIV Primary Care. Through the four-year track, a learner can obtain a Master's of Public Health.

Residents will receive education in chronic disease management, social determinants of health, population health, obesity management, and care of vulnerable populations — including homeless outreach, addiction medicine and Suboxone management, and HIV primary care. Residents will also have the opportunity to work on a community project that will positively impact the community and improve patient care.



Advanced Rural/Global Medicine and Surgical Experience

The ARMS (Advanced Rural/Global Medicine and Surgical) Track is a unique and innovative four-year track designed to prepare “comprehensivists” capable of providing essential medical and surgical care in low-resource settings. ARMS builds on the core competencies of medicine, pediatrics, obstetrics, and rural-global training at JPS to include training in General and Plastic Surgery, advanced procedural skills, endoscopy, and additional intensive care training (PICU, NICU, SICU, MICU). Residents are encouraged to pursue electives in international or rural sites with a heavy surgical focus, including C-sections. During the fourth year, all of the ARMS residents take an international trip with JPS faculty from General Surgery, Family Medicine, and Plastic Surgery. Some ARMS residents also join a general surgery resident and attending on international trips to the Philippines and Sub-Saharan Africa (Niger or Kenya).

Street Medicine

JPS Health Network's location in the busy Southside of Fort Worth offers many opportunities to care for those who need us most. Our residency has a track entirely dedicated to Street Medicine, meeting our patients where they are in their reality, on the streets, under bridges, and in their encampments within Tarrant County. The Street Medicine Track includes: time spent in direct patient care on the streets, didactics regarding special topics for vulnerable patients (i.e., addiction medicine or wound care), and specialized opportunities to interact with the healthcare and homeless service systems for people experiencing homelessness (i.e., an inpatient consult team, working with local political and mental health officials).



Accomplishments of Faculty and Alumni

“Coming from a small town in South Texas, I always knew that I wanted to do full spectrum family medicine. When I was in medical school, I realized OB was part of the full spectrum that I wanted to provide in my future practice. JPS with our Maternal Child Health track seemed like a perfect fit. It wasn't until I got to JPS that I realized that I wanted to push the limits of 'full spectrum' even further, something that the JPS family medicine program is at the forefront of. Another special group for me is the geriatric population. Taking care of people of all ages is already part of family medicine, but this group is a population that I wanted fellowship training on as well. The AIRE program has allowed me to integrate Family Medicine, Geriatrics, and MCH over my third and fourth year of training. With my MCH and Geriatrics training I will be able to provide 'womb to tomb' care for my patients no matter what stage of life they are in.”
